The twenty second annual meeting of the Northern Section of the Classical Association of the Pacific States was held December 29 and 30, 1932 in Portland in conjunction with the annual meeting of the general Classical Association of the Pacific States and the Department of Classical Teachers of the Oregon State Teachers Association.

Dr. Frederic L. Dunn, chairman of the Oregon Classical Teachers Department called the meeting to order at 1:30 P.M. Dec. 29 in the Lincoln High School Building. After appointing a nominating committee for his group he turned the meeting over to Professor Wm. E. Kirk, chairman of the Northern Section who presided at the afternoon session. The attendance was somewhat larger than usual, about 34.

The second session met at Reed College on Friday morning at 9:30 A.M. Professor Lawrence Hartman, president of the Classical Association of the Pacific States presiding. The morning's attendance was 17.

Farley secretary-treasurer of the general association. An amendment to the Constitution was proposed extending the term of the secretary from three to four years, for the general Association.

Minutes of the
Twenty-fourth Annual Meeting of the
Northern Section of the Classical Association of
the Pacific States (was) held at Portland, Oregon,
December 28, 1934.

After a Classical luncheon at the Tea
Room in the Bedell building at 12:30 with
Miss Grace B. Townsend as chairman, the group
adjourned to the Lincoln High School for a
joint program of the Northern Section of the
Classical Association of the Pacific States and
the Classical Section of the Oregon State
Teacher's Association.

The meeting was called to order by
President Frank C. Taylor at 1:45 P.M.
After Dr. Taylor's brief explanation of the
Classical Associations organized together for
the whole United States, the relation of the
Pacific States, the desirability of, qualifi-
cations for and help from membership, the
first four topics of the program were
presented. The paper of Professor Griffin,
however, was read by Mr. Kenneth McGill of
Reed College.

In the absence of the Secretary-treasurer of the
Northern Section, Miss Grace S. Norton, Miss
Kathleen Caldwell of Hillsboro was appointed
secretary pro tem by the President. The
secretary-treasurer's reports for 1934-1935
were read. Both reports were accepted and
approved.

At the close of the combined program,
the nominating committee, through its chairman
Professor ^{Fredric} S. Dunn, reported the nomination of
Mrs. Gertrude K. Ballaine of the University of
Washington for president for 1935, Mrs.
Catherine H. Westwood of Forest Grove Union High
School for vice-president and Miss Grace C.
Norton for secretary-treasurer. The report of
the committee was accepted and the nominees
declared elected. At four-thirty the meet-

ing was adjourned
