Classical Association of the Pacific States

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

I. NAME

This organization shall be known as the Classical Association of the Pacific States.

II. OFFICIAL ORGAN

The Classical Journal shall be the official organ of the Association.

III. SECTIONS

1. (a) The territory covered by the Association shall be divided into three Sections, to be designated respectively Northern Section, Central Section, and Southern Section.

(b) The Northern Section shall include all territory north of the parallel which divides the States of California and Oregon.

(c) The Central Section shall comprise that part of the State of California which lies north of the northern boundary line of San Luis

Classical Association of the Pacific States

At the meetings of the Association at Berkeley, California, on July 12 and 13, 1916, it was voted:

I

(a) That the Secretary-Treasurer be authorized to sign the agreement with the University of Chicago Press relative to supplying the Classical Journal to members of the Association.

(b) That the Secretary-Treasurer be authorized to make an arrangement with the secretaries of the several Sections as to the division of the expense account between Association and Section, with the proviso that at least \$1.50 shall be paid into the general treasury for each member reported from the individual Section.

II

(a) That the fiscal year of the Association end on August 31.

(b) That the annual meeting of the Association be held successively in the territory of the three Sections. To insure the attendance of the President, that officer shall be chosen from the membership of the Section which is next to have the annual meeting.

(c) The expenses of the Secretary-Treasurer or other designated representative of the Association to the annual meeting shall be paid out of the general treasury, if the funds on hand are sufficient.

(d) That it be recommended to the Sections which are represented by an associate editor of the Classical Journal, that the associate editor be selected to act as secretary-treasurer of the Section.

III

(a) That the above legislation be printed and distributed in the various Sections.

(b) That other details of organization and administration be referred to the Executive Committee with power to act.

Obispo, Kern, and San Bernardino Counties, together with the State of Nevada.

(d) The Southern Section shall comprise that part of the State of California which lies south of the northern boundary line of San Luis Obispo, Kern, and San Bernardino Counties, together with the State of Arizona.

2. In all matters of purely local concern, the Sections shall have full jurisdiction, electing officers and holding such meetings as will best serve the interests of the individual Section.

IV. OFFICERS

1. (a) The officers of the Association shall be a President, three Vice-Presidents, and a Secretary-Treasurer.

(b) The presidents of the Sections shall serve, ex-officio, as the three vice-presidents of the Association. But if the president of a Section is also an officer of the Association as a whole, then another person from that same Section shall be chosen as a vice-president of the Association.

2. The Executive Committee shall consist of the above named officers, together with the managing editor of the Classical Journal and three other members chosen from the Association at large.

V. TENURE OF OFFICE

1. The President and the elected members of the Executive Committee shall hold office for one year, or until their successors are chosen.

2. The Secretary-Treasurer shall be elected for a term of three years.

3. All elected officers may be candidates for re-election.

VI. MEETINGS

1. (a) There shall be an annual meeting of the Association, to be held at a time and place designated by the Section in the territory of which the meeting is to be held.

(b) At the annual meeting officers shall be elected for the ensuing business year of the Association.

IX. AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

1. At any annual or special meeting of the Association, the Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by a three-fourths vote of the members present, provided that the text of the proposed amendment is placed in the hands of all members of the Executive Committee one month before the date of the meeting at which the proposal is to be considered.

2. A quorum shall consist of twenty members.
