#### PERSONNEL, TRAVEL, SCHOLARLY ACTIVITIES

#### GONZAGA UNIVERSITY

The Rev. Fredric W. Schlatter, S.J., Chairman of the Department of Classical Languages, is on sabbatical leave during the spring and summer. He left for Athens on February 26th, where he planned to spend two or three weeks. After that he was to go to Rome and other parts of Italy. The Rev. John J. Monahan, S.J., is Acting Chairman of the Department.

Viktor Poeschl visited Gonzaga on February 5th and lectured on "Dido and Aeneas" to an audience of 60 students, faculty, and townspeople.

A recent visitor to the Northwest was Michael Werner (A.B., Gonzaga, 1966), who is spending this academic year in Zagreb, Yugoslavia, where he is doing research on his doctoral dissertation for Stanford. His research is connected with the Palace of Diocletian at Split, where he has participated in excavations.

Professor Hans Dietz has been appointed Chairman of the Classics Section of the annual meeting of the Pacific Northwest Conference on Foreign Languages to be held in Boise, Idaho, April 16-17.

The Rev. John H. Taylor, S.J., has been appointed to the regional selection committee of the Institute for International Education for screening applicants from graduate schools seeking Fulbright Fellowships in Greece, Italy, Spain, and Portugal.

William J. Bingham, a senior in Classics at Gonzaga, was one of eight Woodrow Wilson Fellowship Finalists in the State of Washington.

Professor Dietz has been notified that he has had articles accepted for publication in Gymnasium and in Rivista di Cultura Classica e Medioevale.

The sixty-eighth annual meeting of the Philological Association of the Pacific Coast was held at Gonzaga, November 27th and 28th. Over 300 people attended. Two sessions were held for the reading of papers in the Classical Section, and these two sessions drew large and appreciative audiences.

Dr. Sheila McNally, art historian from the University of Minnesota, lectured on the excavations at the Palace of Diocletian in Split at the meeting of the Spokane Society of the Archaeological Institute, January 26th.

## WASHINGTON STATE UNIVERSITY

Greek is being offered now for the first time at WSU (under the odd label of Foreign Lang. 499/599), by Professor Hack Chin Kim. Thirty regularly enrolled students and five faculty and faculty wives who are auditors make up the class. It is bigger than any other language class there. Professor Kim notes an air of exhilaration among his students and likens the experience to "a honeymoon after many years of repression." It is hoped that Greek will continue to be offered at least up to the second year level. In view of the current rather astonishing enrollment figure, there is a good chance that it will. Congratulations to Professor Kim!

## UNIVERSITY OF WASHINGTON

This year the Summer Classics Program will place special emphasis on a course for teachers which will examine in depth the new approach to Latin teaching provided by Oerberg's Lingua Latina. Professor William M. Read will teach the course and will present the new Guide he has been preparing in cooperation with Mr. Oerberg and several high school teachers. Professor Read has had great success in using Lingua Latina with beginning Latin students and believes it may provide the answer to many of our problems.

The Summer Classics Program continues to provide the opportunity to earn the M.A. in Latin by attendance in summers only. A wide selection of advanced and graduate Latin courses is available, along with courses in elementary and intermediate Attic Greek, Classics in English, archaeology, and ancient history.

The University's Summer Balkan Program will include a one-time-only intensive course in Elementary Modern Greek, to be taught by Professor Colin N. Edmonson. This will be an introduction to spoken modern Greek, with emphasis on conversational skills, the vulgar written idiom, and the reading of contemporary demotic Greek. The course will meet daily from 9:40 a.m. to 1 p.m., for 15 credits.

## UNIVERSITY OF BRITISH COLUMBIA

Professor M.F. McGregor, Head, received an honorary degree, D.C.L., from Bishop's University in October, 1970. Professor McGregor also presided at the meeting of the American Philological Association, December 28-30, 1970, in New York City, as President of the Association and delivered the Presidential Address, "Democracy: Its Admirers and Its Critics."

Other members of the Department of Classics contributed to the joint APA-AIA meetings:

Two members presented papers at the meeting of the Classical Association of Canada, June, 1970, in Winnipeg:

- R.B. Todd, "Anaxagoras B 12."

At the meeting of the Classical Association of Canada, summer 1971, in St. John's, J. Russell will report on excavations at Anemurium and will contribute to the presentation of C.W.J. Eliot's paper, "John Galt: A Scotchman's View of Greece."

The University of British Columbia, in conjunction with the University of Toronto, conducted excavations at Anemurium in Turkey during the summer of 1970 and hopes to return in 1971. The team of archaeologists is directed by J. Russell along with C.W.J. Eliot and E.H. Williams, senior archaeologists.

C.W.J. Eliot has resigned from the University of British Columbia to accept the position of Professor of Archaeology (in residence), American School of Classical Studies at Athens.

P. Harding has completed all the requirements for the Ph.D. at Berkeley and R. Todd received his Ph.D. from Princeton.

M. Walbank has completed his dissertation, "Athenian Proxeny Decrees of the Fifth Century," under the supervision of M.F. McGregor, and received his Ph.D. from the University of British Columbia. He is now Assistant Professor at the University of Calgary.

J. Russell will be on study leave during the 1971-72 academic year and K.A. McCallum will rejoin the Department.

#### UNIVERSITY OF VICTORIA

With the Department of Classics during 1970-71 in a visiting capacity, Dr. John Molyneux of Sheffield University will be returning with his family to England at the end of the academic year in order to resume his teaching duties at Sheffield.

Dr. David Marsh of London, England, is spending the current year with the Department as a Visiting Assistant Professor.

Those who have visited Victoria to read papers include: Dr. Keith Aldrich of Santa Barbara; Professor Godfrey Tanner of Newcastle University, Australia; Dr. T.F. Carney of the University of Manitoba; Professor F.W. Walbank, the Sather Professor of Classical Literature. Professor Donald Earl will be visiting the campus about the middle of March.

Attending the meetings of the APA in New York at the end of December were Professor Geoffrey Archbold, Dr. John Molyneux, Dr. Gordon Shrimpton and Dr. David Marsh.

#### ROOSEVELT HIGH SCHOOL (SEATTLE)

Roosevelt High School has had a busy year. Such events as a mythology quiz bowl sponsored by their chapter of the Junior Classical League, various lectures by outside speakers, the traditional Roman banquet, Saturnalia celebration, give an indication of the variety of experiences offered to the Latin students in addition to a fine course of studies. Their student publication, Nuntius Fidus, is a very good piece of work. Students working on it are to be congratulated.
