News from the University of British Columbia

During the current academic year Professor C. W. J. Eliot, a former member of the U.B.C. classics faculty and now at Mt. Allison University, N.B. is at U.B.C. preparing his contribution to the final reports on Anemurium, in conjunction with the U.B.C. members of the Anemurium excavation team. Professor G. N. Sandy will be resident in Aix-en-Provence for this academic year, pursuing research on the influences of the Greek novel on later European literature.

The U.B.C. Press has recently published books of Professors A. J. Podlecki and A. A. Barrett, repectively, The Early Greek Poets and their Times and Francis Rattenbury and British Columbia. [Francis Rattenbury was the architect of the B.C. parliament building and the Empress Hotel in Victoria.]

The Classics Department continues to be active in various archaeological projects. Professor Barrett participated in the excavation of the Romano-British city of Wroxeter [Viroconium], in which he has been involved for a number of years. Professor Hector Williams, recently returned from Athens where he served as Director of the Canadian Archaeological Institute, led a small team in an exploratory season of excavation on the citadel of Mytilene and also continued to direct the survey of the Arcadian city of Stymphalos, where the application of the latest geophysical prospecting equipment has produced striking evidence of the city plan. Professor James Russell inaugurated the newly established U.B.C. Archaeological Practicum at Capernaum, where he, along with five U.B.C. students, participated in the consortium excavating the eastern part of the site alongside the sea of Galilee.
