Seattle Pacific University

The School of Humanities will be re-instituting Latin studies, beginning in the Fall of 1986. Elementary Latin will be taught in alternate years, rotating with the current program in elementary Greek to allow a major in Latin parallel with the major now offered in Classical Greek. The classical languages are strongly supported across the campus by courses in ancient history, the history of philosophy, art history and literature in translation. It is expected that Latin will be welcomed by students already majoring in Education, since there is such a shortage across the nation of qualified Latin teachers.

University of British Columbia

U.B.C.'s archaeologists are busy on various fronts. Williams conducted excavations at Mytilene, Lesbos, and at Anemurium, Turkey, in the summer of '85 and presented a paper at an international conference on Shipbuilding in Antiquity in the Piraeus in September. He also organized the 15th annual Medieval Studies Workshop at U.B.C. on November 15-16 on the topic Frankish Life and Society in Greece and the Levant. Jim Russell conducted an archaeological practicum in Israel last summer and is spending this year in Rome on sabbatical leave. Four students from the department received the M.A. at the November graduation Their theses and major interests represent a broad ceremonies. range of subject: gnomic utterances in Aeschylus, Theocritus, Plutarch's Life of Galba, the Aristotelianism of Themistius. The departmental Classics Club, besides its regular program of local and visiting speakers, including Sarah Pomeroy, is broadening its activities.

University of Victoria

David Campbell continues to make progress on the third volume of the Loeb Greek Lyric, while he waits for the appearance of the second volume; he also contributed a chapter on Monody to the Greek volume of the Cambridge History of Classical Literature, and an article to the Festschrift for Leonard Woodbury. John Oleson, who recently became archaeological editor for Classical Views, is on study leave this term: he spent some weeks of the

summer at Caesarea, preparing for the final publication of excavations there, and also undertook field research in Jordan in preparation for new excavations. Keith Bradley acted as quest editor of Classical Views for a special issue on Roman social history, and his book on Slaves and Masters in the Roman World appeared. Peter Smith's longstanding interest in Fine Arts has led to his being invited to give a paper on the classical tradition in Canadian public architecture at the A.P.A. meetings in December. The Department's administrative talents continued to be in demand, with Sordon Shrimpton chairing the Hispanic and Italian Department and remaining heavily involved in Faculty Association affairs, while Sam Scully continues as Dean of Humanities. John Fitch, while standing in for John Oleson in the Chairman's office, is experimenting with the Cambridge Latin course in Beginning Latin, and finding the students' initial reactions to the text are favorable. Donald O'Brien continued his research into Roman military history over the summer, and rejoins us for a second year as Visiting Lecturer.

Patricia Clark completed her M.A. thesis on Cicero's family, while two other graduate students have started work on theses, Pamela Hegedus writing on Anacreontea, and Edmund Hunt on Propertius IV. A fourth year undergraduate, Michael Chase, won first prize in the national essay-writing competition of the Classical Association of Canada, and has now begun graduate work in the department.
