INFORMATION ABOUT THE MEETING

Arrival

By car: From I-5 take the Northeast 45th Street exit and head east to the University, using the entrance at 45th Street and 17th Ave. or 15th Ave and 40th Street. Parking is available on campus for \$1.25 per day.

From the airport:

Taxi service is available and runs about \$21.00. There is also a bus service run by EAse-Airporter from the airport to the University Plaza Hotel (\$7.00--\$12.00 round-trip). It departs from the very northern end of the airport every hour on the half-hour until 8:30 p.m. and then at 9:45 and 10:45. (Their telephone number is 743-3344.)
