The treasurer wishes to call the members' attention to the new CAPN membership year, approved at the 1987 meeting, and in effect from the time of the 1988 meeting. The new membership year will coincide with the academic year, running from September 1 through August 31. In this year of transition, the first new membership year will run from March, 1988 through August, 1989.

The new membership year corresponds to the subscription year of most journals, and should clear up perennial confusion in this area. <u>Subscriptions ordered on the new CAPN membership form are understood to begin in January or September, 1988</u>, according to the journal's subscription year.

Correction to Minutes of Annual Meeting, 1987

The Secretary wishes to amend the dates in the discussion of the new CAPN membership year, which are erroneous, through his own fault, in the minutes published in the October, 1987 edition of the <u>Bulletin</u>. The correct dates are reflected in the following:

The recently past CAPN membership year ran, as has been traditional, from annual meeting to annual meeting (from April, 1987 through March, 1988, as stated on the membership form).

Due to the change approved by the members at the 1987 meeting, the coming CAPN year will run from April, 1988, through August, 1989. Thereafter, the CAPN year will coincide with the beginning of the academic year, running from September 1 through August 31.

The dues increase to \$5.00 (US) is in effect for the first time with the membership year beginning at the upcoming 1988 annual meeting.


