- 1. News from Members and Announcements

Jim Russell from the Classics Department of the <u>University of British Columbia</u> shared with us that very active department's recent Newsletter. The following is merely a sampling of its varied contents.

Hector and Caroline Williams had a successful sixth season at Mytelene on the island of Lesbos (Greece). We wish they would present a report in Victoria. In addition to the conventional finds of such an excavation (wall paintings, pottery, etc.), they came upon a "... 19th-century Turkish burial with the remains of a rotted wooden coffin in a stone crypt that contained the bones of a massive man, buried with great iron spikes through throat, crotch and ankles. A Turkish vampire?" (H. Williams, UBC, Classics Dept. Newsletter, Winter 1988)

Jim Russell spent five weeks last summer at Anamur, Turkey. He has been working on this site for close to two decades. While there, he supervised the cleaning, repair and mounting of a large mosaic for the new museum and visited two Byzantine sites, noted by Freya Stark in <u>Alexander's Path from Caria to Cilicia</u> (1958), where he made some fascinating archaeological discoveries.

Shirley Sullivan has published two books: <u>Psychological Activity in Homer, A Study of Phren</u> (Carleton University Press), and <u>The Philosophical Orations of Thomas Reid</u> with D.D. Todd (Southern Illinois University Press).

Anthony Barrett, author of the definitive edition of Janus Pannonius, has completed a manuscript of his biography of the Emperor Gaius.

Phillip Harding has returned to the department from a year as Visiting Professor in the Department of Classics at the University of California, Berkeley.

Undergraduate enrollments in the Department of Classics show a substantial increase.

Jim also notifies us of the sad news of Dick Sullivan's sudden death on July 12, 1988. He taught at the University of Saskatchewan from 1967 to 1980. At the time of his death he was adjunct Professor of History at Simon Fraser University and the historian for the Naukratis Project in Egypt. His family, friends and colleagues will miss him.

EXCAVATION IN ISRAEL

Interested in excavating at a significant Graeco-Roman site in Israel, Sepphoris / Dio Caesarea, this summer? Sepphoris is located in Galilee 15 miles west of the sea of Galilee and 15 miles east of the Mediterranean Sea. Josephus called the city the "ornament of Galilee". It minted its own coins in the first through third centuries A.D. and had its own system of weight and dry measures. The editor of the Mishnah lived the last 17 years of his life there. So far a theater, Roman style house, an aqueduct and a public building that contained a spectacular mosaic of Dionysian revelry have been among the significant

finds.

The excavations, directed by Dr. James F. Strange of the University of South Florida, welcome applications from faculty and students alike for the 1989 excavation from June 16 to July 24. For applications write either:


