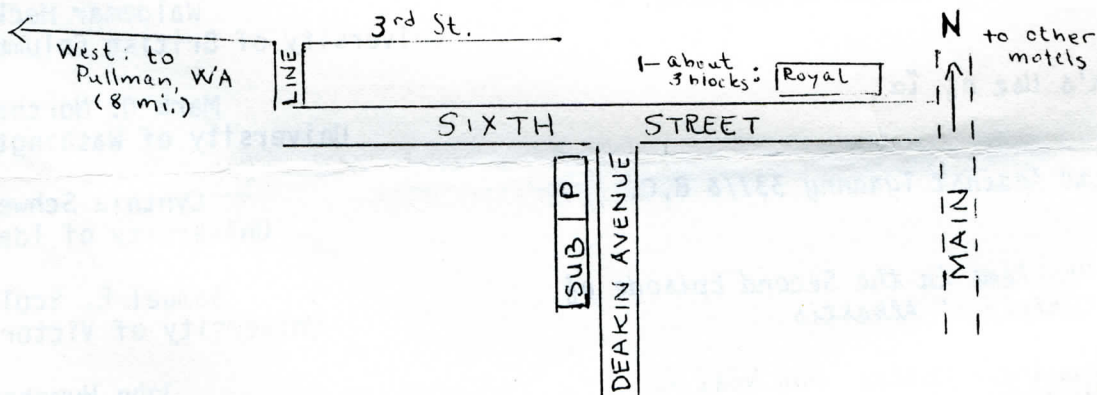

Most of Moscow's restaurants are on Sixth Street and Main Street; recommended are: The Moscow Mining Company, on Sixth, near the campus and The Bacchus Room in the Moscow (Apartment) Hotel at 313 S. Main. For the adventurous who prefer out of town dining: The Lumberjack Cafe (on Highway 8, in Troy, about 11 miles east of Moscow) and Pete Hoseapple's on Troy's Main Street; in Pullman (about 8 miles west of Moscow), Misfit Limited, S. 170 Grand, and The Ram Pub, 1100 Johnson Road.

CAPN SCHOLARSHIP GRANTS

Applications for the two grants which CAPN will award this year will be accepted beginning 1 April 1977. The first grant, of \$150, is for summer study in the classics, to defray the cost of enrolling in a summer school course in Latin or Greek at a recognized university in the Pacific northwest area. The grant will be awarded to a teacher who intends to remain active in teaching the classics at the secondary level. The second grant, of \$50, is for the purchase of materials to be used in the instruction of Latin or Greek: preference will be given to a school which has a current or potential program of language instruction in Classics, but has a clear need for essential teaching materials:

The Women's Classical Caucus will again present a panel at the 1977 meeting of the American Philological Association at the Atlanta Hilton Hotel in Atlanta, Georgia, December 28-30. The general topic of this year's panel will be Women in Classical Antiquity. Abstracts of two to three pages should be submitted to:

The deadline for submission is September 15. Five copies of each abstract must be sent. Since submissions will be judged anonymously, authors should identify themselves in a covering letter, but not type their names on any copy of the abstract. There will be a time limit of twenty minutes on the final presentation. Papers involving the use of slides and other audio-visual materials are welcomed. The Women's Classical Caucus encourages contributions from scholars in archaeology, history, anthropology, comparative literature, art history, and other disciplines.

The American Classical League: Methodology Committee A: Latin and Basic Language Skills

Because of concern over declining SAT scores and other evidence of students' deteriorating abilities with languages, native and foreign, the American Classical League is undertaking a project to organize and circulate information about the connection between the study of Latin and development of basic language skills. The chairperson of ACL Methodology Committee A is Edward V. George, Department of Classical and Romance Languages, Texas Tech University, Lubbock, TX 79409; the local members are Galen O. Rowe and C.A.E. Luschnig, Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures, the University of Idaho, Moscow, ID 83843. Especially welcome is information about already conducted tests on Latin learning and basic language ability.
